

Polling Methodological note – 18.02.2018

The Kantar TNS Research Express Online Omnibus interviewed a representative sample of 2,448 adults in Great Britain between the 6th and 12th February 2018. All interviews were conducted as online self-completion. The Kantar TNS Research Express uses the Lightspeed access panel as its sample source.

The data was weighted to match population totals for age, gender, working status, 2017 General Election voting patterns, 2016 EU referendum voting patterns, education, region, and likelihood to vote in the next General Election. Further details on the weighting are given on page three.

Voting intentions

The voting intention figures provided aim to show the current political opinion of the nation rather than to accurately predict the outcome of the next General Election.

Changes in methodology since our last poll

The weighting now controls for vote in the 2017 General Election by country. It should be noted that this change has almost no impact on the headline voting intentions. Without this change they would have been Conservative (40%), Labour (39%), Lib Dems (9%) and UKIP (4%).

Margin of error

The figures are estimates based on a sample of the population of Great Britain; this means that there is a degree of uncertainty around each estimate. On the assumption that – conditional on the weights - the sample is practically equivalent to a random sample, the survey estimates have a margin of error of up to ± 3 percentage points. This uncertainty means that it is important that each individual poll is not viewed in isolation.

Brexit Confidence Index

Respondents were asked about the impact (positive, negative, no effect) they expect Brexit to have on the following areas:

- the price of things they buy
- the standard of care in the NHS
- the standard of schools where you live
- the mix of people in their local area
- your job and career opportunities

The “Brexit Confidence Index” is a summary of the public mood across these different areas.

The index is calculated by subtracting the proportion who think there will be at least some negative effects due to Brexit and no positive effects from the proportion that think that there will be at least some positive effects due to Brexit and no negative effects.

Excluding those who have not told us which scenario they favour or which scenario is most likely – 43% currently think the eventual Brexit deal will most likely match their preference.

Likelihood to Vote in General Election

We have estimated the likelihood that each respondent will vote in the next General Election. This value is based on respondents' stated intention to vote, their age and whether they voted in the last general election. The expected population turnout has been included as a population total in the weighting matrix. This turnout has been estimated based on the relationship between sample and population turnout rates in the 2015 general election.
