Published 13th March 2013

TNS BMRB was commissioned by the Scottish Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament to conduct research into attitudes towards nuclear weapons in Scotland, and how these relate to views on Scottish Independence.

TNS BMRB is a member of the British Polling Council (BPC) and abides by its rules. We also operate within the Code of Conduct of the Market Research Society (MRS). In accordance with these rules the following information is provided:

Sampling points	61 Scottish parliament constituencies
Fieldwork dates	20 th – 28 th February 2013
Interview method	Face-to-face, in-home
Population sampled	All adults aged 16+ in Scotland
Sampling method	The poll was conducted through our Omnibus, Scottish Opinion Survey. For this survey, sampling points are selected to be representative of Scotland demographically and geographically. Within each sampling point, a quota sampling method is used for respondent selection.
Data weighting	Data is weighted to the profile of all adults aged 16+ in Scotland, based on population profile estimates from the BARB (Broadcasters' Audience Research Board) Establishment Survey 2 Years Ending December 2008 and the 2001 Census. Weighting is carried out in relation to working status within gender, age, social grade and electoral region. Unweighted and weighted bases are shown at the top of each data table.
